Thinking of Selling Your Home?

If you are planning to sell your home, please remember that you are responsible for providing the purchaser with a copy of the legal documents for the Seneca Forest Homeowners Association.

As the Seller of the home, you or your agent are required by Maryland State Law to provide the prospective buyer with a "resale package" at least five days prior to settlement so they may review the Association governing documents.

The Buyer must sign at the settlement table that they have read and will abide by the governing documents.

Free Bulk Trash Collection

The Association has arrangements for FREE BULK collection on the 1st Thursday of every month.

This will include furniture and mattresses. Items such as carpet, toilets, and lumber are NOT included.

METAL items must be collected by the County for recycling AND MUST be scheduled in advance.

See information below for details on METAL.

The schedule will change for months with holidays that fall in the 1st week of the month. The Management Group will issue an email blast reminder just prior to each pick up for those residents that have provided management with an email address.



Security & Safety Tips

- ✓ Don't leave vehicles running to avoid theft. This is a violation of the Maryland Transportation Code. Also, stolen vehicles are then often used to commit another crime.
- ✓ Install quality locks on exterior doors.
- ✓ Never leave a house key under a mat, under a flowerpot, etc.
- ✓ Report suspicious activity to police at (301-279-8000).
- ✓ Invest in & use a home surveillance system.
- ✓ Ask for ID from delivery or service persons.
- ✓ When disposing of holiday boxes remove information about the make, model, and serial number of the item from the box and save this information for your records. Also flatten & bundle the cardboard for recycling.
 Styrofoam is NOT recyclable and should be put in the trash.
- While shopping stay alert and be aware of what's going on around you, park in well-lit spaces, lock doors, hide shopping bags/gifts in the trunk; avoid carrying large amounts of cash, be careful with purses/wallets, and do not overburden yourself with packages.

ANOTHER GOOD REASON TO CLEAN YOUR GUTTERS

Trees growing in the gutters of your home are an ominous sign that you may soon have water leakage into your house, into the insulation or into the wall board eventually allowing mold to grow in these damp places. Downspouts need to be clear to take the water from the gutters and get it away from your house. If there is a buildup of debris (leaves, seeds, grit, etc.) in the downspout and gutters, it means that the water will not drain and, in fact, might even become a welcoming place for more plants and trees to germinate and grow.

With the gutters full, even if they are only partly filled with debris, a downpour of rain will fill them to overflowing and water will pour over the sides of the gutter. This means that water is pouring onto your wall and into your house. The process may take time; there might never be a leak that you can see, but inside where the insulation and wallboard are getting wet, it is providing perfect conditions for mold to start growing. Eventually, treating the mold by removing the wallboard and insulation is a much more expensive proposition than regularly cleaning the gutters and downspouts.

Unfortunately, sometimes just having a next-door neighbor with a problem can create a problem for you. If there is a rush of water in the area where the two houses meet, you too can get spillover, creating water leakage into your own house, insulation, etc.

For these reasons, be sure to clean your gutters regularly (at least once a year) and ask your neighbors to do the same.

Holiday Tree Recycling



The County will collect holiday trees on your recycling day year round. Please put your holiday tree at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on your collection day.

Christmas trees are given a new life after being composted or chipped for mulch, so keep the tree in a natural state.

- Remove the stand and all decorations, including lights, ornaments, tinsel, and garland. Be sure there is no metal attached to the tree.
- Remove any plastic bags from your tree.

"Live" Christmas trees with root balls and <u>artificial</u> <u>trees</u> cannot be collected as part of this program.

Montgomery County Pet Laws



At Large: Any dog or cat is at large if it is <u>outside the owner's premises and not leashed</u>. The Association common areas are not the owner's premises.

Penalty for Violation: \$100 for first offense, \$500 for each subsequent violation.

Animal Defecation: Montgomery County Code, Sec.5-203(a) (2): An owner must not allow an animal to damage or defecate on property outside of the owner's property. An animal may defecate ... if the owner immediately removes and disposes of the feces by a sanitary method approved by the Director (Animal Services Division, Department of Police). Feces may be picked up in a plastic bag. If this bag is placed inside another plastic bag, it may be put out for disposal in your normal household trash. **Penalty for Violation - \$100**

Animal Noise: (Montgomery County Code, Sec. 5-203(a) (6): An owner must not allow an animal to cause noise that is loud enough and persistent enough to disturb another person's quiet enjoyment. **Penalty for Violation - \$100**

- Call (301) 279-8000 Police Non-emergency to report an animal bite or a violation of animal control laws.

County Metal Recycling: Call Ahead

Montgomery County will collect certain types of scrap metal from the curb on **Tuesday** morning if you call **240-777-0311** by 11:00 a.m. on Monday, or fill out an online form at

Items include: Washers and Dryers, Refrigerators (doors must be removed), Bikes, Sewing Machines, Grills, and Other Large Metal Items, Swing Sets (disassembled), Lawn Mowers (no riding mowers, drain the oil and gas, remove batteries – you can take oil and batteries to the Shady Grove Transfer Station. Visit www.mcrecycles.org then click on Facilities for Transfer Station hours).

NO Automotive Parts will be accepted at the curb!
